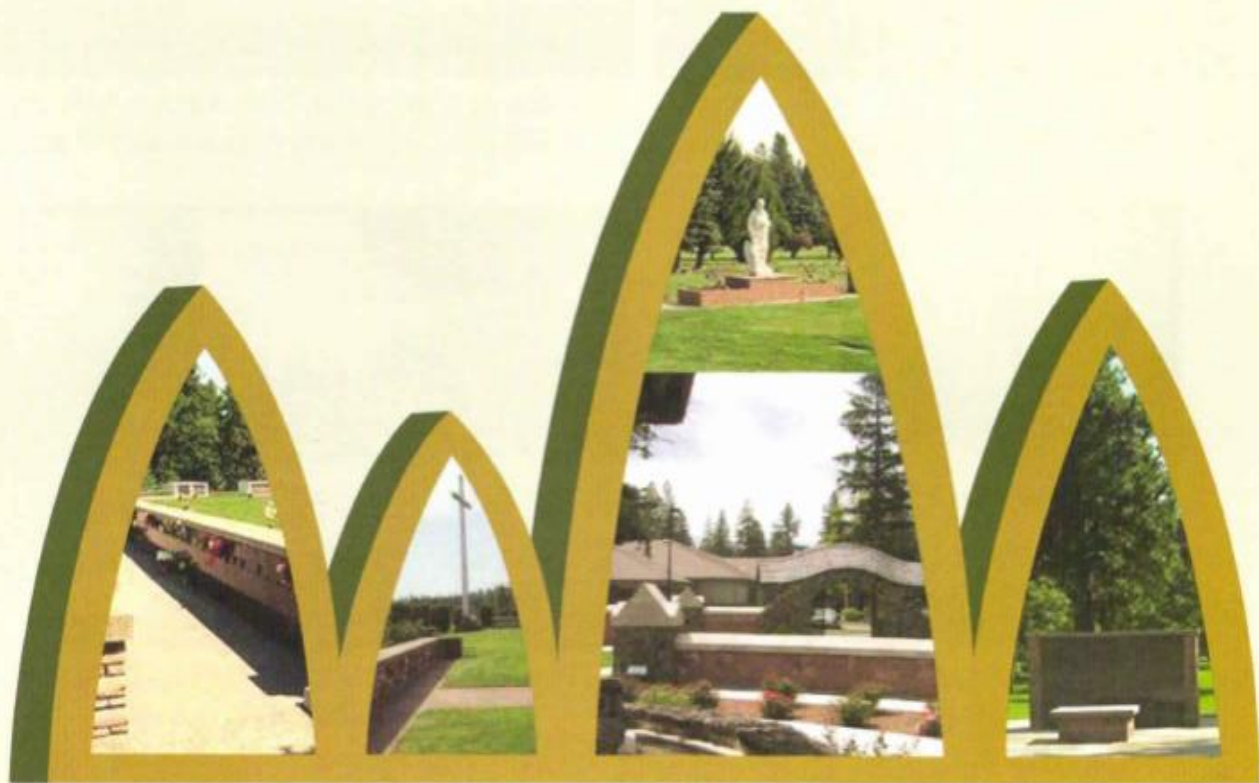

Cremation - A Preparation for Memorialization

Memorials are stepping-stones to the past and to the future, linking generations. Each one of us is a different individual and our lives should be remembered and celebrated as such. Memorialization through the establishment of monuments and name plaques or markers is a time-honored tradition practiced through the centuries. As survivors, we care about and want to remember our loved ones preceding us. Selecting and establishing a permanent memorial satisfies an immediate need and also fulfills the need to preserve our heritage.

Just as with a traditional burial, the process of cremation is only a part of the preparation for memorialization. The options for the final placement of your loved one's cremated remains and the permanent memorials to honor their memory are many.

Although the selection of a personal cremation memorial may require some important decision-making, once it has been accomplished it will give you and the generations that follow much satisfaction. Permanent memorialization provides a lasting tribute to a loved one, peace of mind and a place of pilgrimage.

It is never too soon to set up a visual symbol that will perpetuate cherished memories. Many families make their memorial selections in advance so that personalized designs and decision-making can be done together and eliminated during a time of stress.

Columbarium

A columbarium is an outdoor or indoor wall containing niches designed to hold cremation urns. An outdoor columbarium may be a wall overlooking a beautiful panoramic vista or a central feature within a lawn or garden area. An indoor columbarium may consist of an entire room or wall along a corridor in a mausoleum or chapel located in the cemetery. Niches come in many sizes with a selection of fronts such as glass, marble, bronze or granite. Some niches are designed for specific size urns while others may contain space for two or more urns. Many glass fronted niches allow personal memorabilia and pictures to be placed inside, along with the urn.

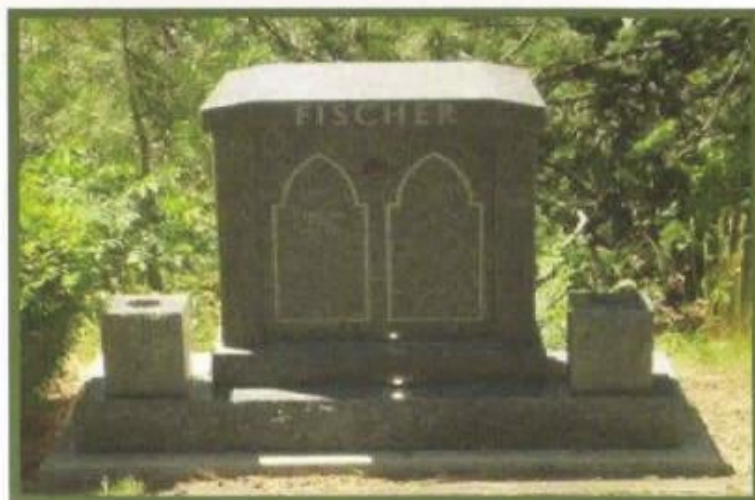

Private Family Columbarium & Benches

Monuments, pillars and benches designed to house the placement of cremated remains create a more personal way to memorialize the memory of your loved ones. These monuments can be used for those who have chosen cremation or in combination with family members who have chosen casketed burial creating a private family plot area.



Urn Garden

For those who desire in-ground interment, the cemeteries have Urn Gardens designated specifically for the interment of cremated remains. These gardens may be in a lawn or floral garden setting and will accommodate a variety of personalized stone or bronze memorials.

Casket Graves, Second Interment

If you already have a casket burial space, you may choose to inter the cremation urn as a second interment there. Memorialization options also include floral vases featuring a name and date ring at the base.



Cinerarium

Cremation urns may be placed on a memorial shelf in the Riverside Memorial Park Cinerarium building with a plaque placed on the memorial pillar located on the building's lawn. The Cinerarium presents a viable option for those families who have not yet finalized their permanent memorialization plans.

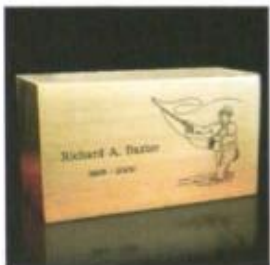
Scattering Garden

The cemeteries offer garden areas dedicated and maintained solely for the scattering of cremated remains and the placement of a permanent plaque on a memorial wall or pillar.



Cremation Urns

Cremation urns for the permanent containment of cremated remains come in a variety of sizes, styles and materials. Urns range in size from single to multiple capacity and in styling from the traditional book shape and classic Grecian design to novel creations and decorative art pieces can be personalized to depict an individual's hobby or special interest.



Keepsake Urns

Many urns are also designed in miniature to hold a small portion of the remains to be retained by family members as keepsakes. They are especially appropriate when only a portion of the cremated remains are to be scattered or when families choose to divide the cremated remains among family members. Keepsake options also include decorative pendants designed to hold a small portion of cremated remains.

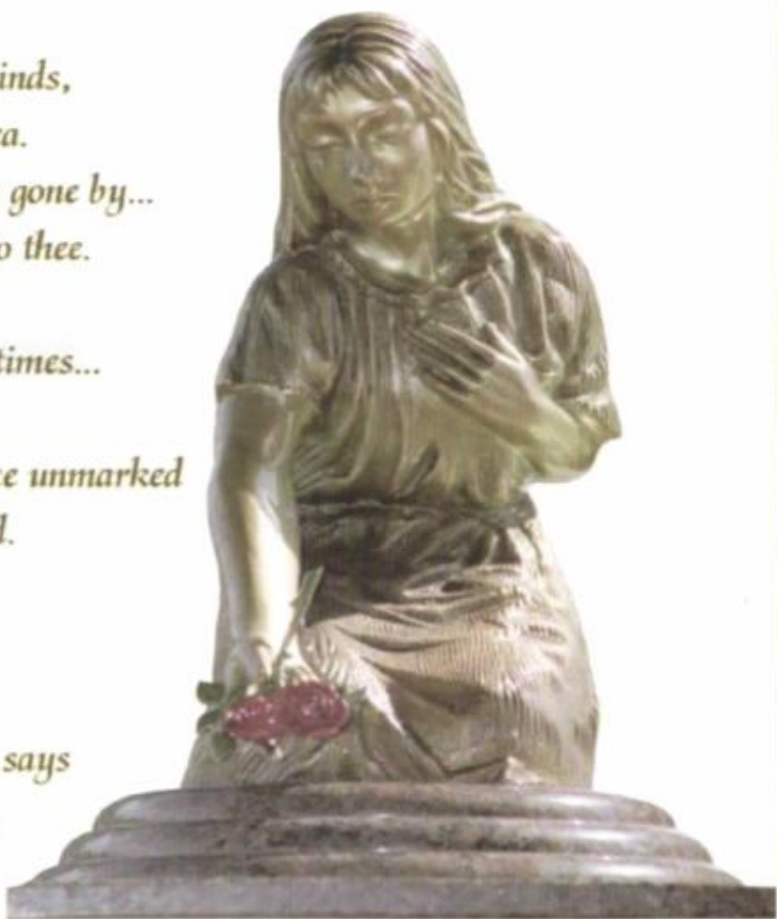
One Final Gift
